The Annual Battle of the Bands competition in Boca Raton is set to take place at 7 p.m. on Aug. 9 at the Mizner Park Amphitheater, 590 Plaza Real. Bands interested in participating in the competition can submit their online applications until June 21. Bands with three or more members, where at least two of them play a musical instrument, can apply by selecting an Under 20 or 20+ competition category. The band should also submit a two-song demo video of a live performance (not a music video) with a YouTube or Vimeo link. The competition will have finalists in each category who will compete on stage at the Mizner Park Amphitheater. The winning band in each category will be presented with a \$2,500 cash prize.
